Sixth Sunday of Easter 5 May 2024 (YEAR B)

There is something deeply mysterious about faith. Why does faith seem to come to some easily, whereas others seem to struggle? Furthermore, I always find the different perspectives that draw people to faith and that are expressed and lived by people of faith quite amazing in their diversity. Some are struck by beauty and liturgy; others are more moved by the content of the faith and its various teachings and



traditions. Still others feel drawn to faith as they encounter the mystery and dignity of the human person, and as they seek to maintain that dignity through social justice and community building initiatives. We each have a bit of all of these perspectives informing our faith: belief and struggle, experiential and rational, transcendental and grounded. However, most of us will primarily relate too just some parts of the whole panorama which is the landscape of faith.

Given all of this diversity of inclination and experience, we might conclude that it is difficult to pinpoint the essence of faith. Likewise, it can be challenging to hold all this diversity together even while allowing a creative tension between these differing perspectives. Such a creative tension is necessary to ensuring we don't become to narrowly focused, thereby diminishing the mystery of faith.

St John, however, rightly points us to that which is essential for the person of faith. It is the one who loves, St John insists, who knows God. This 'essence' doesn't reduce the diversity of faith experience or expression. On the contrary, we can come to know and experience the Father's love for us in many ways. Likewise, we can express love for one another in ways which



exercise all of the gifts that the Spirit gives us. Love, in its diversity of experience and expression is truly the essence of faith. So let us each, in our wonderful diversity, follow the teaching of St John and love one another.

Reflection by Dianne Bergant CSA

The boundlessness of God's love is seen in the fact that God loved us even before we were deserving of God's love. In fact, it was God's love that made us able both to receive and to give love in return. Love is of God; love is God. Divine love is constant and trustworthy. How easily we can think this thought or speak these words, yet how difficult, even impossible, it is to comprehend what it means. We can only really recognise love in its many concrete manifestations. Love is patient, kind and forbearing; it believes, it hopes, it endures. The love of God breaks down the barriers between Gentile and Jew, between slave and free, between the poor and the prosperous, between women and men, between the healthy and the ailing, between young and old.

Embraced by such love we are gradually transformed. We begin to recognise God's love in places we never suspected it would be found. We discover that what we once judged unclean may merely be an unfamiliar openness to God's truth. We discover that our own insistence on legitimate religious practice may really be spiritual elitism. Our eyes are opened to ways we have tried to confine God's love to the conventional boundaries we ourselves have set. As we are drawn into God's love, we eagerly embrace the commandments that help us to live righteous lives. To the extent that we love as universally as God does, we will know that we live in God and that God lives in us.


