The very heart of our Christian faith is the mystery of the Incarnation. God didn't simply say nice things to us or merely offer a few hollow sentiments of encouragement. Rather, God acted on our behalf, becoming one of us in the person of Jesus.


In Christ, the goodwill of God, expressed in the words of Scripture, becomes a living word—flesh and blood—and is expressed in the more powerful language of good works. We see this in Christ's acts of healing, compassion, and mercy, but, above all, we witness this upon the Cross, where Jesus offers himself, in tangible, concrete action, on our behalf.

Given this example of Christ, it's little wonder, then, that St James insists our faith, if it is to be truly faith, must be more than simply words or kind sentiments. Good sentiments are useless unless they are incarnated in good works. As Christians, we are called to be disciples of Jesus, which is to say, we study and learn from the life of the teacher. This discipleship doesn't take on the shape of purely scholarly study; rather, it's more like an apprenticeship, implying an imitation of Christ. Jesus affirmed this when he taught: "The disciple will be like his master." To live out the Christian faith is to follow Jesus, not simply in name, but in the manner of our lives.

To be clear, St James is not speaking to the later church debate surrounding the idea of 'salvation by faith alone vs good works'. For sure, works by themselves are not the source of our salvation. It is faith in Christ that is necessary, and that faith finds its necessary expression in our good works. Therefore, let us live what we believe.


