In our culture, faith is often considered a 'personal' matter - something deeply private and individual. This is true to a certain extent because our faith does touch upon our identity and informs our deeply held values and ideals.



Furthermore, our faith must be 'personal' in the sense that it is 'I' who believe it and follow it. However, our faith ought not to be 'personal' in the sense that it is closed off from being informed by the experience of others or expressed

and lived as part of a faith community.

In this weekend's second reading, St Paul reflects on the way in which God has provided for the Church. The Spirit is poured out on each of the baptised, dwelling ever so intimately and personally within our souls. Yet, while it is the same Spirit, the gifts and their expressions are different, so that no one person has all the gifts.

Without wanting to sound greedy, one might well ask - why doesn't God give me all the gifts of the Spirit? The answer is because He wants us to belong to the Body - the Church. The gifts of the Spirit are lived corporately so that my gifts may benefit others and theirs may benefit me.

Reflecting on this reality, we can draw two conclusions. Firstly, faith is not meant to be lived alone. Christ calls us to belong to His Church and to experience faith and worship together. Secondly, if I have been given a gift (however modest or developed it may be), I am called to express it and share it within the life of the faith community.

What gift has God given you to share with our parish community?

Was there a kind of delight to such a secret act of kindness – a kind of self-satisfaction that comes from inside? Why is that?



#### St Agnes - Feast day January 21

St. Agnes is widely known as the patron saint of young girls. She is also the patron saint of chastity, rape survivors and the Children of Mary. She is often represented with a lamb, the symbol of her virgin innocence, and a palm branch, like other martyrs. She is shown as a young girl in robes holding a palm branch with the lamb either at her feet or in her arms. Her feast day is celebrated on January 21.

On her feast day, it is customary for two lambs to be brought in to be blessed by the Pope. On Holy Thursday the lambs' wool is removed and woven into the pallium the Pope gives to a newly consecrated archbishop as a sign of his power and union with the pope.


