This weekend, we celebrate the feast of the Presentation of the Lord. It commemorates the moment when, soon after his birth, Mary and Joseph take the child Jesus and present him in the temple. They offer a 'redemptive sacrifice' on his behalf.

According to the Torah, the firstborn male of every creature belongs to God and must be offered in sacrifice. The firstborn son, however, must be redeemed; a sacrifice is offered in place of the son - normally a lamb. However, an accommodation is made for those who cannot afford a lamb, allowing them to offer either a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons.


Here, we see Jesus presented as one of us. He stands with all humanity, sharing in our weakness and mortality. As the Son of the Father, Jesus obviously does not need to be redeemed. Rather, this action prefigures his own sacrifice for our redemption. He is the 'Lamb who takes away the sin of the world.' However, in the Incarnation, he enters fully into our condition and makes himself obedient to the Law.

The author of the Letter to the Hebrews, in this weekend's second reading, places great importance on Jesus' full sharing in our human weakness. It is precisely because he is one like us that we can have confidence in his mercy. Jesus, having shared in our humanity, has walked the way before us. As one who "has himself been through

temptation," he is an example for us as we strive to hold fast to God's law. He is also the High Priest who, full of compassion for us, has offered himself for our redemption.

St Agatha's Church – The Last 100 Years 1925 – 2025

On 5th April, the St Agatha's community will gather to celebrate the 100th Anniversary of our beloved Church. To help everyone appreciate the rich history, the CMC will be sharing segments of this journey with the parishioners over the coming months.

Part 1: The Need for a Church in Clayfield

In the early 1920s, as Brisbane's Catholic population continued to grow, the need for new places of worship became increasingly apparent. One such place was Clayfield, one of Brisbane's most picturesque suburbs. Situated on Widdop's Hill, with sweeping views of the Brisbane River and Moreton Bay, this would soon be the site of a new church: St Agatha's Catholic Church. This church would not only serve as a place of worship but also become a cornerstone of the community.

A Parish Is Born

The story of St Agatha's began in 1917, when Archbishop James Duhig, recognizing the expanding Catholic population in Clayfield, purchased three acres of land to build a new church. Prior to this, Catholic families in the area had to travel to nearby suburbs like Wooloowin, Nundah, or Hamilton to attend Mass. However, as the community grew particularly during the challenging years of World War I - the need for a church of their own became more urgent.

The Archbishop's vision was clear: a vibrant Catholic presence in the rapidly developing suburb of Clayfield.

In 1918, a timber church-school designed by T.R. Hall was opened on the land, marking the first step towards what would eventually become St Agatha's Church. While this timber structure served as a temporary solution to accommodate the growing community, it quickly became evident that a more permanent building was needed to meet the demands of the faithful.

Activities in our Parishes

<u>Saturday Adoration</u>: The Blessed Sacrament is exposed every Saturday, 6am - 4:00pm at OLHC Hendra for personal prayer. For any enquiries, contact Julie Anne 0418 193 235 or Pat 0411 597 781.

<u>Parish Spirituality Group</u>: The group meet at 9:30am on the first Tuesday of the month in the Parish Centre at Hendra to discuss the gospel reading for the next Sunday.

<u>Portofino Mass</u>: Fourth Wednesday of the month at 11am. Due to safety and security reasons, only residents of Portofino attend. Eucharistic Ministers of Holy Communion distribute Holy Communion to residents every Sunday.
