Gospel reflection: Finding True Happiness in Trust and Faith

The readings for the 6th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C guide us to find true happiness by trusting in God and believing in Jesus' resurrection. Jeremiah warns us not to rely only on human strength.


Those who trust in people are like dry shrubs in the desert, without life or growth. But those who trust in God are like trees planted by water. They are always green, bearing fruit. This image shows that only God can give us the support and strength we need.

In the second reading, Paul emphasizes the hope of the resurrection. He teaches that if Jesus did not rise from the dead, our faith would be empty. But because Jesus is alive, we have hope for eternal life. This hope in the resurrection gives us strength and purpose, even in hard times.

The Gospel of Luke contrasts the blessings of the poor and hungry with the woes of those who are rich and satisfied now. Jesus warns that those who find their joy in earthly comforts may miss true happiness. Instead, Jesus calls us to look beyond this life and seek happiness in God.

The 6th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C encourages us to rely on God, find hope in the resurrection, and remember that true happiness lies in Him. Each reading invites us to put our trust in God's care and seek His lasting joy.

As you reflect on the 6th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C, think about where you place your trust. Do you lean on your own strength, or do you rely on God? 
PRAYER SUPPORT—First and Third Sundays of the month

MEMORIAL SERVICE—ST JOHN'S CHURCH—FRIDAY 28 FEBRUARY

On 1 and 4 March 1942 in the vicinity of Java, Indonesia HMAS Perth (see photo), HMAS Yarra and HMS Anking were sunk in battle with the Japanese Navy. Hundreds died from those ships, including 61 Queensland sailors who are commemorated on the Honour Board at St John's War Memorial Church, Northgate.

At this anniversary time, a short memorial service will take place at the start of the <u>9.00am Mass at St. John's on Friday 28 February 2025</u>. There will be Morning tea and pictorial display following Mass. All very welcome.


St. John's Church the only civilian church in Australia that is an official war memorial to the Royal Australian Navy. It is also Heritage Listed.

St Agatha's Church – The Last 100 Years 1925 – 2025

Father Frank O'Connell St Agatha's Foundation Parish Priest 1921-1939

Father O'Connell, born in Dublin, educated by the Christian Brothers, was an excellent singer and handy soccer player. In 1914, he was ordained and set sail for Brisbane. He spent time in Gympie and Ipswich before arriving in Clayfield in March 192. He was the first Parish Priest of the newly formed parish, which had been part of the parish of Wooloowin.

Clayfield Parish, the Archbishop thought, was the 'Jewel in the Crown.' The initial church was a timber construction finished in 1918. Father immediately saw a need for a catholic school. It was apparent straightaway that the Church was not large enough. So that same year, the Church we know now was commissioned and completed in 1925. For 10 000 pounds. It could hold 500 people.



The old timber Church became St Agatha's School. Years before, Archbishop Duhig had approached the Presentation Sisters to come to Brisbane. On the completion of the present Church Father Frank again approached this order. St Agatha's School opened, 27 January 1925, with 120 students under the guidance of the Presentation Sisters.

Father Frank was courageous. He built a beautiful Church, presbytery, St Agatha's School and looked after the Sisters. He was also the key to the establishment of the development of St Rita's (a high school for girls) and St Columban's, for boys. During the War, he hired relief gangs to dig into the stone hill to build tennis and basketball courts. It was the Great Depression, these people would not have jobs otherwise.

Father Frank was known for his kind manner, great sermons, warm smile and being zealous. "He was a man of extraordinary organising ability, supported by a strong faith and reliance on prayer."

Fr Frank died in the year of his silver jubilee, on 28 December 1939. He had played golf the day before.
