We are about to enter the solemn season of Lent. This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday, and my invitation to each of you is: make the most of this moment of grace!



What is Lent all about? What is its objective? In the end, the objective of Lent is the same as the ultimate goal of the Christian life—union

with God. Similarly, the disciplines of Lent can and should be lived at other times of the year as well. Lent, therefore, is a more intentional and more intense living out of the Christian life.

St Paul's letter to the church in Corinth points us in the right direction. We are to put to death that which belongs to the 'perishable' body and so put on the 'imperishable' body. We unite ourselves, through prayer and fasting, with the crucified Christ—so as to share in His Resurrection. Thus, the final outcome of our Lenten journey is to sing with St Paul his triumphant hymn: "Death, where is your victory? Death, where is your sting?"

A great way to start the Lenten pilgrimage is by participating in the Ash Wednesday Mass. Here, the faithful are signed with ashes, and as they are signed, they are also exhorted to follow Christ more closely: "Repent and be faithful to the Gospel."

Another great way to enter into Lent is to make use of the Lenten reflection books, which can be purchased for \$5. As it turns out, I am the author of this year's reflections, so I hope you enjoy them and find them useful.

As we begin this holy season, then, let us trust in the comforting words of St Paul: "Keep on working at the Lord's work always, knowing that, in the Lord, you cannot be labouring in vain."

St Agatha's Church – The Last 100 Years 1925 – 2025

St Agatha's 3rd Parish Priest 1968-1989 Rev Father Vincent Rowan

21 Again

Father Rowan had been the Parish Priest of St John's Northgate for 21 years before taking over the reins of St Agatha's. 21 must have been his number! He guided St Agatha's Parish for the same length of time... 21 years. As he was a talented opera singer, he taught Liturgical Music to seminarians of Banyo, again for 21 years!

Father Rowan considered himself a 'builder,' as opposed to an academic.

Traditionally, the first job of a new Parish Priest was raising money for the headstone of the previous priest. He began the process but was told that Monsignor English's tombstone had been taken care of in a will. Tick! Unfortunately, for Father his future tasks were far more challenging.

It was a testing time as he had to implement the massive changes of the Second Vatican Council. Some of controversial directives; the laity was to be more involved in the Mass; readings were to be in English; and hymns were introduced. Poor Father was seen as by many as a "perpetrator of change." He was even told by a parishioner, 'We don't do these things at Clayfield!'

The old timber structure, that was St Agatha's school, also needed replacing. A new school was built in 1973. Father Rowan was much loved by the St Agatha's children, as he regularly visited classrooms and playgrounds.

He had many parishioners and staff as close friends. His loyalty to his parish, and prayer and concern for the sick, was evident in his fortnightly visits to parishioner, Margaret Harrington, at Holy Spirit Hospital. She was immobile and could only move her eyes. He prayed beside her for himself as a priest and for the welfare of his parishioners.

Father also began, with a group of dedicated Parishioners, what is now known as a Parish Council. This successful group was, 'Clayfield Care.'

Property Foresight

In 1969, he purchased the house next to the presbytery to ensure the site was not demolished and turned into six pack units, which was happening all over Clayfield. He quickly off loaded the property to a parishioner who promised to make it a family home. For years, these neighbours looked after each other.

Quick Facts Father Rowan served as Vicar General of the Archdiocese. 1974 – 1989 He instigated a Diamond Jubilee Celebration for the School and Parish - a luncheon with speeches, and 1985 St Agatha's students recited poems and sang. 1986 The parishes of St Agatha and St Cecilia's were combined. The first Parish Newsletter was published by the newly appointed Pastoral Associate, Sr Carmelita. 1987 She was described as, 'The Sister of Perpetual Motion,' teaching religion at State Schools, creating beautiful banners for the altar, was a sacristan, member of St Vincent de Paul, prepared children for their Sacraments, visited the sick, studied theology ... 1989 Father Rowan had a stroke and could no longer fulfil the duties as Parish Priest. 2004 Father Rowan died on 20th February.
