Gospel Reflection: Mercy and Forgiveness

The 7th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C teaches us about being faithful to Jesus' call. Jesus tells us to love our enemies, which goes against the way our world usually works. Today, we often see competition, especially in politics and on social media, where getting ahead seems most



important. Imagine how different things could be if we truly loved our enemies and showed forgiveness and mercy to everyone.

Jesus' message is clear. We are called to a life of mercy, just like David showed mercy to Saul. Mercy means choosing kindness over revenge. It means forgiving others, even when it is hard. This path is not easy, but it brings us closer to living like Jesus.

Forgiveness is something we all need. We might think it is just for those who have wronged us, but we also need it for ourselves. Holding grudges can harm us and prevent us from finding peace. Jesus reminds us that we should forgive to be forgiven.

Healing from wounds takes time. When someone hurts us, the pain doesn't disappear overnight. We can pray for God's help in healing our hearts. Asking for the strength to let go of our need for revenge and for the desire to forgive can lead us to true peace.

On this 7th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C, let's remember Jesus' teachings. By choosing love and mercy over revenge, and by seeking forgiveness, we can live a life that reflects Jesus' love. This change in our hearts can make the world a better place.

Prayer

Lord, help us to follow Your example of love and mercy. Teach us to avoid judging others and to show compassion instead. Give us the strength to live like Jesus, spreading kindness and forgiveness. Amen.

NAVY MEMORIAL SERVICE — FRIDAY 28 FEBRUARY—St John's Church




On 1 and 4 March 1942 in the vicinity of Java, Indonesia HMAS Perth, HMAS Yarra and HMS Anking were sunk in battle with the Japanese Navy. Hundreds died from those ships, including 61 Queensland sailors who are commemorated on the Honour Board at St John's War Memorial Church, Northgate.

At this anniversary time, a short memorial service will take place at the start of the 9.00am Mass at St. John's Church, 688 Nudgee Rd, Northgate, this Friday 28 February 2025. There will be morning tea and a pictorial display following Mass.

We warmly welcome the families of three of the RAN servicemen (William Michael Nolan, Paul Sebastian Doneley and Ronald George Meikle-see photos below) who will be attending the service. All very welcome.







St. John's Church is the only civilian church in Australia that is an official war memorial to the Royal Australian Navy. It is also Heritage Listed.

St Agatha's Church – The Last 100 Years 1925 - 2025

St Agatha's 2nd Parish Priest 1940-1968 **Monsignor John English**

Scholar and Administrator

John English was born in Rossmore, Tipperary, Ireland, in 1897. He was the youngest of 10. He was educated by the Jesuits. He completed his post ordination studies in Rome, where he topped every class.

In 1925, he was sent to Nambour. In 1926, he became foundation Rector of St Leo's College. He lectured in the US, and then came back to the Cathedral in Brisbane.

In January, 1940, Monsignor English was appointed St Agatha's Parish Priest. He was a great orator, giving captivating sermons. Monsignor English was extremely witty. He loved to play practical jokes. These 'jokes' were reported to be many and varied.

RECTOR, St. Leo's University College, 1928-1935. ADMINISTRATOR, St. Stephen's Cathedral, 1935-1940. PARISH Priest, Clayfield, Jan., 1940-April, 1968. DIED, Clayfield, Easter Sunday, 14th April, 1868. Requiescat in Pace.


In 1846, he accompanied the Bishop and clergy from St Agatha's, St Rita's and St Columban's to the USA to research higher education.

"He was a shy, very private person and a very holy man." Loved

his dogs conversations reading, naps and entertaining smoking Disliked confetti gossips leaving Mass early: " If you leave the Mass early you are like Judas. He left the Last Supper before it was finished'"

Monsignor English arranged for funds to be raised to finish the sanctuary. St Agatha's Church was influenced by the Italian Romanesque architecture; had a marble altar, brass pulpit and stain glass windows from Dublin. He engaged the curator of the art gallery to choose colours. Apparently, the initial gold dome was far more spectacular than the present blue.

Monsignor was an intellectual, practical joker, orator but it was his warmth and welcoming nature that his parishioners loved.


This week our students put their best swim skills to the test with the St Agatha's Swimming Carnival held on Friday at Clayfield College. Thank you to our many volunteers who
