Last week, we made a strangely disrupted start to the season of Lent. With one of the Ash Wednesday Masses and most of the weekend Masses cancelled due to the impacts of Cyclone Alfred, it feels a little premature to find ourselves arriving at the Second Sunday of Lent. Despite this interrupted start, I invite you to enter as deeply into this season as you possibly can.



St Paul, in his letter to the church in Philippi, gives us some important practical advice. We all learn by imitation to some extent, so we must be careful who we admire and imitate! The world around us throws itself into the things of this world and its pleasures. Practically speaking, it prioritises earthly things over heavenly things, which, in the end, is a form of idolatry. St Paul teaches that we should not look to them for guidance but rather imitate those who live the Christ life!

In many ways, Lent is meant to be a period of training. We enter into the disciplines of this season of grace so as to emerge at Easter more like Christ. It follows, therefore, that the one we must truly imitate is Christ himself-not so much in the biographical details of his life, but rather in the sentiments that moved him. We fix our eyes on Christ and learn from him, for he is "meek and humble of heart (Mt 11:29). In prayerfully contemplating the heart of Christ, our prayer is: "Make my heart like unto thine" (Prayer to the Sacred Heart).

I hope this season of Lent is truly fruitful in your lives.



All are also warmly invited to join your fellow attendees for morning tea afterwards in the Hanly Room, next to the Cathedral of St Stephen.




