The book of Exodus recounts the people of Israel's journey from slavery in Egypt to freedom in the Promised Land. St Paul likens this experience of liberation to the sacrament of Baptism: "They were all baptised into Moses in this cloud and in this sea." St Paul presents

Moses as a 'type' of Christ (which is to say he prefigures Him) and the Red Sea crossing as a 'type' of Baptism. For just as Moses led the people of Israel through the waters of the Red Sea, so too Christ leads us on our own Exodus journey, through the 'waters of Baptism' and into our heavenly homeland.


Yet we know that Baptism, while fundamental, is simply the beginning of our Christian journey. This was true for the people of Israel, who found themselves wandering in the desert for forty years until they had learnt to trust in God sufficiently to enter the Promised Land. Likewise, St Paul warns the Church in Corinth that they ought never to be presumptuous or assume that their freedom of heart is so complete that they cannot fall back into the slavery of sin.

The freedom of heart to which our faith journey leads us is not easily obtained. We need the help of grace, and we need to grow in self-control and our capacity to master our internal desires. Thus, day by day, as we embark on the desert journey of this life, we learn to live more fully the Christ Life.

During this beautiful season of Lent, we have the opportunity to grow in interior freedom and renew our trust in Christ. As we exercise the disciplines of this season—especially prayer, fasting, and charitable giving—we unite ourselves with the people of Israel as they wandered in the desert. Let us consciously desire and strive for the freedom that is God's gift for all His faithful.



St Agatha's 5th Parish Administrator 1998 - 2015**Father Adrian Farrelly**

Dr Adrian Farrelly was born in Mackay, Queensland, on December 14, 1948. His primary and secondary education were completed mainly in Brisbane, Queensland.

He returned to Brisbane to enter Pius XII Provincial Seminary, Banyo. Ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Brisbane in 1973, he served three years in the parish of Ekibin, then seven years in Gayndah. During that time, he received a Bachelor of Divinity degree from the University of Queensland. He began his studies in canon law at Saint Paul University Ottawa, in September, 1983, receiving his Licentiate in Canon Law in 1985, and awarded a Doctorate in Canon Law in 1987.





On return to the Archdiocese of Brisbane he continued work in the Regional Tribunal. In 1993 Archbishop Bathersby appointed him Judicial Vicar of the Regional Tribunal of Brisbane. He is a judge of the Regional Tribunal and the National Appeal Tribunal. In addition to these duties he is a member of the Council of Priests, College of Consultors, Spiritual Advisor to the Cursillo Movement in the Archdiocese, President of the Canon Law Society of Australia and New Zealand, Dean of the Central Deanery, and a member of the executive of the Banyo Priests' Association.


Fr Farrelly was appointed Administrator of St Agatha's Church, Clayfield in mid-April 1998. His appointment as Administrator, not Parish Priest, reflects the changing face of the Archdiocese as the Archbishop works to make best use of a decreasing number of able priests.

Fr Farrelly was no stranger to St Agatha's. He began school in the parish and was in prep with Sr Anita. He made his first Holy Communion here and was confirmed here by Archbishop Duhig. Father Adrian was involved with different parish groups and in the school. His view of a parish is of a community of committed, faith-filled, practical Catholics which encourages growth of all in the community – especially in their faith but in all other areas as well.

Father Adrian took up a position at St Patrick's Parish, Gympie, at the end of 2015.

Father Adrian retired at the end of January this year.
