This is undoubtedly the most significant decision these men will ever make. Let us unite ourselves in prayer with them as they, relying on the guidance of the Holy Spirit, discern the needs of the Church and the world, and who it is that should occupy the



the needs of the Church and the world, and who it is that should occupy the Chair of St Peter.

Who is the Pope called to be? He is referred to as the 'Vicar of Christ'; A vicar is someone who represents and acts on another's behalf. That is to say, like all members of the clergy (but at the highest level of governance) he represents and acts in the person of Christ.

This weekend's second reading, from the book of the Apocalypse, coincidentally, places us in Christ's throne room. There is ultimately only one authority in the Church. He is the Lamb found worthy, the one who acts with power, wisdom, strength, honour, glory, and blessings. The mission of the Pope is to make present the power of Christ. He is to speak not his own words of wisdom, but those of the Church; those of Christ. Let us pray that the Lord will grant the Church the Pope that our times need, to gather the flock and shepherd them in the name of the one true Shepherd, Christ our Lord.

ARCHDIOCESE OF BRISBANE MASS COUNT 2025

Parishioners are advised that for a four week period **starting this weekend**, **4 May**, the Archdiocese of Brisbane has requested a Count of Mass Attendance.

Attendance is to be recorded at Mass for each church on the weekends of 4th May, 11th May, 18th May and 25th May.

After Communion at each Mass over the next four weeks, a head count will be taken of all attending each respective Mass. This information will then be forwarded to the Archdiocese of Brisbane.

The annual Mass Count provides valuable insight into trends of attendance at both a local level and an Archdiocesan level, a summation of which will be shared with parishes later this year.
