Bishops carry many responsibilities, particularly in governance and in their teaching ministry. Yet even more important than these 'practical' roles is whom they represent. Bishops are the locus of communion in the Church and a visible sign of its unity. They represent the universal communion of the Church, in union with their fellow bishops under the leadership of the Pope. Most importantly of all, they represent the crucified and risen Christ.

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross. This feast reminds us that those who exercise leadership in the Church must do so in the manner exemplified by the Good Shepherd: Christ, who, taking up the wood of the Cross, laid down his life for the salvation of the flock entrusted to his care. He is the universal Shepherd in whom all legitimate pastoral ministry has its source. In a particular way, the ministry of the bishop should stand, within his local Church, as the prime example of and the continuation of Christ's own ministry for the sake of his people.



Starts: Wednesday October 8, and continues on Wednesdays throughout October.


