Authentic Christian faith will always be, to some extent, countercultural. This is true even in countries that are more or less Christian, and it becomes even more evident in our so-called 'post-Christian' culture. There is nothing new in this. The early Church was persecuted, and ultimately Paul himself died a martyr's

death at the hands of the Roman authorities. The authority figures of his time were by no means benign, yet, in his Letter to Timothy he urges Christians to pray for them. This flows from Jesus' teaching to pray for those who persecute you - not only for their own good, but also in the hope that the Church might have the freedom to live its faith and carry out its mission of evangelisation in peace.

Compared with many places and times, the Church in Australia enjoys relative freedom and, often enough, even a sense of overlap and cooperation with government, especially in causes related to the common good, such as education and social justice. Yet at times our faith places us in some level of conflict with government - for example, around issues relating to the sanctity of life or, increasingly, questions about human identity.

When faith is lived in a secular society, within the context of an increasing diversity of views and ethical frameworks, there will be points of tension and, at times, radical disagreement. This can be difficult to navigate, yet St Paul offers us a way: we should always continue to advocate for the truth and for freedom of conscience, offering our own lives as an example of faith. And we should pray - even for those who place themselves wholly or partly in opposition to the Gospel.

Join St Agatha's Community and Mission Council (CMC)




